## Freezing and Melting

Exploring the properties of water, we conducted several experiments about freezing and melting. Children expanded their skills of observation and prediction as they used a variety of methods to try and melt ice. They also experimented with freezing water outside.

## Curriculum

This month we will begin focusing on handwriting development using the Handwriting Without Tears program. Children will practice writing letters and words using a variety of materials during small group activities.

As Valentine's Day approaches, we will also be supporting the development of kindness and appreciation through many of our classroom activities.

## Resource Corner

### Helping Your Child Understand the Concept of Kindness

While kindness and empathy are abstract concepts and difficult for young children to understand, they are important skills for children to begin to learn at an early age. Research shows that kindness can have positive effects on health, self-esteem and even happiness.

You can support your child better understanding how to be kind through your own actions and language. Help a neighbor, volunteer in your child's classroom or simply show kindness to your family in your own home. Identifying what the act of kindness was, who it was for, and pointing out how that kindness had an impact, can further help your child understand the importance of being kind.
